Next 5th Tuesday Sewcial features flat zipper bags -- August 29 --

Want to use up your batting scraps? Want to practice free-motion, walking foot, and/or ruler quilting? Please pre-quilt your pieces and then come to the next Fifth Tuesday Sewcial!

Your Guild community service arm has decided to share our resources and expertise with our friend and patron, Ginny Hildreth: we will meet at White Bluffs Quilt Museum on Tuesday August 29 from 1 to 7 to make flat zipper bags for the toiletries that go in the Santa Bags she depates every Christmas.

that go in the Santa Bags she donates every Christmas.

Linda Weir, whose prototype is pictured, will coach us in the zipper application. Prepare by pre-quilting a pair of quilted pieces for each bag; they can measure 8-12 inches wide by 8-12 inches long. Because she finds it difficult to free-motion near edges, Linda suggests quilting a larger piece, then cutting it down. You might also cut into old practice pieces or even old quilts. For fabric, you can raid the Scrap Table at Guild meetings or make an appointment to shop the Community Closet.



2024 Quilt Show Challenge

- ORIGINS -

Origin definition: The point or place where something begins, arises, or is derived. The beginning, start, inception, foundation, base, root, pedigree, lineage, heritage, starting point, or ancestry.

Origin Challenge: Create a quilt depicting your origins. Considerations include:

- Where or when you are from
- Who or what influenced aspects of the person you are today
- Your cultural or ethnic background
- Your foundational beliefs

Rules:

- Must be a current TCQG member to enter
- Entries must reflect the theme of Origins
- Any shape, any fabric, any embellishment is allowed
- Maximum circumference of 200 inches, no minimum size
- All entries must be 3 layers held together by quilting or tying and have finished edges

Entries are due the week of March 4, 2024. Drop off locations TBA. Voting for winners will occur at the March 18, 2024 guild meeting and be displayed at the quilt show.

Eight or ten folks showed up at the May Sewcial to make quilt tops from the green floral fabric. Leftovers cut from the corners of the blocks are also finding their way into quilt tops.

Community Service update and news

Prior to June's meeting there were only 79 quilts distributed. There were 29 quilts turned in at the June meeting. I have delivered a total of 108 quilts through June. I also want to remind you of the incentive to get the quilt bundles quilted. For each quilt bundle that you quilt you will get your name in a drawing. Although the first drawing is in July, there is still time to quilt bundles to get your name in the December drawing.

Although we don't want you to stop piecing quilt tops, we are focusing on getting the quilt bundles quilted. The following information demonstrates the reason why. There are 256 completed quilt tops in the community service pipeline. There are 111 tops that need backing and binding selected/sewn; 81 tops with backing and binding, ready for batting; 64 tops bundled with backing, binding and batting, waiting for a quilter. Thank you to those of you at the June meeting who took quilt bundles.

When turning in quilts/tops, please pin on a community service tracking tag, so we can acknowledge you. Tags are available at meetings and are downloadable from **www.tcquilters.org**.



TCQG 2025 Raffle Quilt

It's time to start the raffle quilt for the 2025, **Make Your Point**, by American Patchwork and Quilting designers. Our scrappy 78"x90" quilt will be done in whites and brights.


You can help with the 2025 raffle quilt. To get us started, you can:

- ◆ Donate fabric—2" or 4"xwof strips of white or white-on-white
- ◆ Donate fabric—2" or 4"xwoF strips of bright, saturated colors
- ♦ Make a 16-patch, to finish 6" (6½" unfinished)
- ◆ Make a pinwheel, to finish 6" (6½" unfinished)

Fabrics should be good quality quilting cotton. If piecing blocks, please also use good quality **cotton** thread only—no polyester—and sew with an accurate ¼" seam allowance.



16-patch



- ♦ 8@2" squares white or white-on-white
- ♦ 8@2" squares bright, saturated colors. Think scrappy.

Arrange according to 16-patch diagram. Sew into rows; press toward bright. Sew rows together into a block; press in one direction. Staystitch

If making several blocks, start with 2"-wide strips. Make several strata of white-bright-white-bright; then subcut the strata into 2"-wide strips. Arrange according to 16-patch diagram. Assemble into a block; press in one direction. Staystitch.




Pinwheel

For each block you need*:

- ♦ 2@4" squares white or white-on-white
- ♦ 2@4" squares bright, saturated colors


* One block will yield 2 brights at most. For a scrappier look, make 2 or more blocks, mixing up the colors in each.

On the wrong side of a white square, draw a light pencil line along the diagonal. Place **RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER** with a bright square. Sew ¼" away from both sides of line. Cut apart along line; press to bright.




Trim units to 3½" square. Arrange according to either Pinwheel diagram. Sew two units together; press to white. Sew pairs together. Undo ½" of stitches within seam allowance of previous 2 seams so center points "twirl" and lay flat; press to white — or press open if you prefer. Staystitch.






16-patch diagram

SUPPLIES TO BRING and NOTES:

- Sewing machine in good working order that can do a traditional zigzag stitch and has stitch length and stitch width controls. Make sure to bring foot pedal, electrical cord, etc.)
- Presser Foot that accommodates the zig zag stitch, (or open toe foot, clear foot or SID foot)
- Good quality cotton thread
- Jeans needles
- Pins
- Scissors
- Seam ripper or awl
- Rope:100 feet 3/16" Hyper Tough diamond braided clothesline available (sometimes) at Walmart in the tie downs/ropes section near the automotive section AND/OR Solid braid rope in 3/16" and 5/16" sold by the yard, available for purchase from instructor

Optional:

- Fabric strips cut ¼ or ½ inch
- School glue
- Fray check
- Clips
- Safety glasses (in case of a needle break if you don't wear glasses)
