2018 Quilt Show News

Show Theme: “Persistence of Pattern”

Pattern! There's so many way to think of the word and the ways we use it in quilting. Do you always use a quilt artist pattern or make up your own design? Do you have a favorite color palette or maybe fabric type? Is there a certain way you always set up to quilt? How do you store your stash?

We all have patterns. They can be a great comfort and make your time go smoothly. There may come a day when you want to break out of your pattern and surprise yourself and your friends.

Looking at mosaic tile art, the term “persistence of pattern” entered my mind. Persistence can apply to time honored blanket quilt blocks such as fans, hexagonal flowers, four and nine patches, and half square triangles. Think of the beauty we create with a variation on circles, squares, triangles, and rectangles. Persistence can order the mind, or drive you crazy. You get to choose.

Category: Guest Artist Laurie Shifrin of [Laurie Shifrin Designs](#) in Seattle will be our guest artist. Laurie has written three books: *Batik Beauties*, *Batik Gems*, and *Batiks and Beyond*. Her website has 21 patterns. Antelope Canyon will be her featured new quilt and will be on the save the date cards and program. If you have made any of Laurie's quilts, they will be hung together in the “Laurie” category.

Additional show categories will be:

Category: Patterns That Persist The unfinished ones: patterns that persist through guilt, orphan blocks or pieces discovered in the back of a drawer or the bottom of a chest. Get them off your conscience: finish what you started in that class or make the project smaller or bigger, make it different or ...

Category: Patterns That Promise The unstarted ones: patterns that persist through excitement, the bucket list of things to try, the ones we haven't begun because we feel inadequate or alone; if it's too much, enlist the company of friends for a swap and/or a quilt-along.

Category: Patterns That Please The patterns worth repeating: patterns so rich with possibility or sewing pleasure that you have re-made them with variations. Space requirements might mean that we hang just a photo of your first version next to your new one.

Express Your OCD*

**Obvious Circle Design*

“Gang of 5” Issues TCQG 2018 Quilt Show Challenge

The circle is certainly a persistent pattern. Across cultures, through time, it has signified totality, wholeness, perfection, the self, the infinite, eternity, timelessness, and cyclic movement. Sometimes it represents masculine power (the sun), sometimes the feminine maternal principle (the encircling waters). It has magical value as a protective agent.

The Gang of 5 friendship group invites you to find or create a circle design and sew your own version of it.

Your challenge entry must contain at least one full, round, 360-degree circle.

Circles can be appliqued (needle turned or machined or fused or raw-edge or portholes) AND/OR pieced (5-minute circles or portholes or drunkard's paths or New York beauties or winding ways or flowering snowball or wedges) AND/OR quilted AND/OR part of the fabric print

Your entry can assume any shape, but its circumference must be no smaller than 80” and no larger than 144”.

So, for instance, if you design in a square, 20x20 is minimum, 36x36 maximum; in a circle, 26 diameter is minimum, 44 maximum ;in a rectangle, 10x30 or 13x27 would achieve the minimum, 12x60 or 15x47 maximum (lots of possible proportions will work ... the math is minimal).

The sky is the limit for fabric content, surface design, embellishment.

Register by Feb 17, turn in by Mar 10; vote at meetings Mar 18.

We'll vote anonymously and secretly (as usual) for our top 3, and the challenge team will choose an honorable mention.

We hope your heads are spinning!

COMMUNITY SERVICE BLOCK JULY-AUGUST 2017

Cowboy Boot - 8.5" X 10.5" UNFINISHED

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

Background: (off-white muslin)

- One 3" square, subcut to FOUR 1.5" squares
- One 7.5" x 3.5" rectangle
- One 2.5" x 3.5" rectangle
- One 1" square

Boot: (your own 2 Southwest-colored fabrics)

Upper boot:

- One 5.5" x 7.5" rectangle

Lower boot/foot:

- One 2.5" x 7.5" rectangle
- One 1.5" X 5.5" rectangle

Heel: (black)

- One 1.5" x 3.5" rectangle



SEWING INSTRUCTIONS:

First, layout the pieces as shown (Pic 1), then:

Sew two background 1.5" sq corners to top of boot fabric.

(fold corners together, sew on folded line, & cut away the two back fabrics on corners)

Add large background rectangle to right side of boot top.

(Pic 2)

Place smaller muslin rectangle on top of the right end of the larger boot bottom rectangle RST, and fold up to make a straight strip as shown in Pics 2 & 1, sew on folded line and cut away the back two fabrics on corners.

Sew a 1.5" sq background to left end of boot heel with the same method

Sew a 1.5" sq background to the left end of boot toe fabric and ditto

Sew the 1" sq to the heel toe, ditto again (Pic 3)

Sew the two lower sections of the boot together and add to the boot top section. (Refer to Pic 1)

Quilt Show: Laurel Sutton reported a 2017 Quilt Show final profit of \$5693 plus income from raffle quilt. Elaine Brouillard, 2018 Show Chair, announced the theme: Persistence of Pattern. Laurie Shifern will be Featured Artist. Deadline for 2018 Challenge is May 31.

Properties: A new wagon has been purchased for guild use. Laurel plans to do a complete inventory of the storage unit.

Raffle Quilt: A chairperson is needed for the 2018 Raffle Quilt. Ginny Hildreth will display the quilt at the May meeting.

Workshops: Jo Matthias and Barbara Minton reported on upcoming workshops from Janine Burke, Joe Cunningham, Nancy Stansbury and Robin Ruth. 2018 Workshops include Ann Shaw and Meri Vahl.

Bus to Spokane Quilt Show: Barbara Minton is reserving a bus for the Spokane show on October 21. At least 25 riders are needed.

Retreat: Spring Retreat attendees enjoyed the new building; upcoming Retreat Chair Ginny Coffman has reserved the facility for next year.

Bylaws: The by-laws committee presented revised Bylaws for discussion.

Meeting was adjourned at 9:10 p.m.; next board meeting will be Monday, June 12, at 6:30 p.m. at White Bluffs.

Cyndy informed the board that the budget for next year needs to be increased for the purchase of batting.


