


December location change

I can't believe that in just six short months we will be having our 40th Annual Tri-City Quilters' Guild Quilt Show, "Inspired by Tradition". I hope this beautiful fall weather inspires you to get

Show quilt registration is approaching. Are you ready?

The quilt show committee is working hard to bring you our 2024 guilt show. We will once again be using the online guilt registration interface to register quilts in the show.

You will be asked to enter your email and password which you will use for all your quilt entries. If you are new to registration, you will create an account. If you have forgotten your password from 2023, there is a button to recover it. Please use a unique password that is not used on sensitive sites on your computer.

There will be several categories for registering your quilt, including "Inspired by Tradition", "Origins Challenge", workshops, collaborations, and other categories.

The guild will use a ranking system if we have more quilts than we can hang. Members will be asked to enter their quilts in ranked order, i.e., the first quilt you enter will be the highest rank among your quilts. If we have to remove quilts, the last one you enter will be considered your lowest ranked quilt and could be selected for removal. Since adopting this rule, we have not had to remove quilts, but you never know!

Registration will open on January 1, 2024, at 12:01AM. Start planning now to prepare for guilt registration. Please contact Nancy Graves, at NANCYJG@CHARTER.NET if you have questions.

2024 Quilt Show Challenge: Origins

Origin definition: The point or place where something begins, arises, or is derived. The beginning, start, inception, foundation, base, root, pedigree, lineage, heritage, starting point, or ancestry.

Origin Challenge: Create a quilt depicting your origins. Considerations include:

- Where or when you are from
- Who or what influenced aspects of the person you are today
- Your cultural or ethnic background
- Your foundational beliefs

Rules:

- Must be a current TCQG member to enter
- Entries must reflect the theme of Origins
- Any shape, any fabric, any embellishment is allowed
- Maximum circumference of 200 inches, no minimum size
- All entries must be 3 layers held together by quilting or tying and have finished edges

Entries are due the week of March 4, 2024. Drop off locations TBA. Voting for winners will occur at the March 18, 2024 guild meeting; guilts and ribbons will be displayed at the quilt show.

Identified with India, this technique was actually imported with enslaved Africans. Linda Williams will guide you in this method of hand-stitching scraps. Bring 20"x16" backing, 19"x15" batting, and scrap pieces; tapestry needle, crochet thread, safety pins, and scissors.



Sashiko class Nov 12 (Sunday) from 1 to 4

This style of traditional Japanese embroidery dates back to the 1600s, when farming and fishing families had to make practical workwear with layers of cloth. Linda Weir will explain thread choice, marking methods, and the "rules" of sashiko,

hitomezashi, and moyozashi. Linda will provide kits for \$15, payable at the class.





The Best of Jelly Roll Quilts by Pam & Nicky Lintott





Pinecone Quilts by Betty Ford-Smith





Round Fabric Art Bowls by Kirsten Fisher






