Tools:

- Machine in great working order (don't forget your pedal and cord)
- the feet should have NO guide)
- Thread
- Cutting mat (a rotating one works great if you have one)
- Rotary Cutter
- Pins
- Painters tape
- Batting/flannel or other design wall option (available at White Bluffs)
- 4.5" square template

Materials for approximately (14) 12.5" star blocks:

Background fabric: (this fabric should have contrast to the fabric used for the stars)

- 1.75 yards of 42" width (there will be some left over depending on design).
- **Prior to class** please cut (7) 4.5" selvedge to selvedge strips and sub-cut into 4.5" squares. You should get (9) squares per strip.

Contrasting Fabric for Stars: Fabric is like ice cream, more is always better. Stick to solids, small prints or almost solids.

- Option I -(56+) Scraps that measure at least 5" x 5".
- Option II -(5 or more) Fat Quarters in assorted prints or solids that contrast with your background fabric.
- Option III- Charm packs of 5" squares are a great option. You will need at least (56 squares) and they need to have high contrast to your background fabric.

***If you'd like to learn the technique and not think about fabric for a whole quilt then bring a couple ¼ yards or fat quarter cuts of fabric for the stars and a ½ yard of fabric for the background of the stars (cut like background directions above). You can make pillows, buckets, potholders, pouches or other items later with the blocks you create.*
