

Quilt Registration Goes Live on January 1st

Online quilt registration opens **January 1st** on our website www.tcquilters.org under the **Quilt Show/Enter an Exhibit** tab. Please read the instructions carefully to help eliminate any errors in your entry.

As members are aware, we have a totally new website again this year. I'm sorry to say that you will have to create a new login profile again. You will be asked to enter your email, password, mailing address, and phone number. You will use this login each time you enter the registration system to register show entries.

We are hoping for over 400 quilts again this year so please give some thought to ranking your quilts by entering your highest ranked quilt first and so on. If the show committee is forced to remove some quilts, the last quilt you entered may be considered for removal. Since adopting this rule, we have not had to remove quilts, but you never know!

If you know a guild member who doesn't have access to the internet, have them contact Nancy Graves at (509) 628-8986. Nancy will help get their quilts entered. Also, the form on page 12 can be used to enter a quilt. Follow the instructions for mailing.

Online quilt registration closes on **February 12th** at midnight. Mailed entries must be received by **February 9th**.

And Robert Kaufmann Fabrics chose **Wander**, "a calm, confident green that invites curiosity and open-ended possibility".



This year, instead of a range of palettes, **The (not so) Dramatic Life** has provided thoughts on PANTONE's recent choices, and has a section on how to use Cloud Dancer in interesting ways.

Registration opens on January 1st. This will be on a first come signup, by email or text.

Cove, OR, is a wonderful place to gather with other quilting friends to relax, go for walks, shop, sew, or to just visit. You can finish up those UFO's or start something new. There's always been plenty of ideas and opinions readily available...

We will have room for 15 members. The cost, at this time, is \$80/night plus a 4-meal package for \$60, 3 dinners and a Sunday breakfast before departure. We have been notified that there will be a moderate price increase (We'll notify those who are interested in attending). There are 11 rooms (2 are ADA). All rooms have private baths and at least 2 beds.

Each quilter will have their own table for sewing and the guild provides large design walls, ironing centers, irons, cutting tables with mats, rotary cutters and rulers. When you are ready for a break there's a sitting area with chairs, a small couch and a beautiful view of the Grande Ronde Valley, with surrounding mountains, plenty of deer, and an occasional dog or two.

Community Service Year in Review

Another awesome year is now in the books. At November's meeting, 47 quilts were turned in and all were delivered. At the Christmas annual meeting, 21 quilts were turned in, and 20 were delivered. One quilt is being held back for the Quilt Show, a half-square triangle quilt from the July meeting. The grand total of quilts donated for the year 2025 is **319 quilts**.

The statistics for the year are: **102 kits created** (20 by "shoppers" at Nov meetings!), and **158 tops donated** (members mostly using their own stash/patterns ... we have several customers who shop the Closet).

The Get a Round TUIT Declutter Challenge

The **Get a Round TUIT Declutter Challenge** will help you declutter your sewing area one category at a time, one month at a time. Of course, we will accept any donation from the list below during any month, but items donated during the designated month will help us with the sorting process.

ANY MONTH **Fabric** (cotton, non-cotton, precuts, fat quarters, panels, scraps)

Jun **Books and Patterns** (quilt, crochet, knitting/cross stitch, etc.)

Jul **Embellishments/Notions** (ribbon, buttons, beads, thread, bias binding, elastic)

Aug **Tools** (scissors, rulers, cutting mats, rotary cutters, knitting needles)

Sep **Batting** (batting scraps, foundation, fusible, interfacing)

Oct **UFOs** (kits, quilt tops, finished quilts)

Nov **Knitting & Crochet** (yarn, thread)

Dec **Other Craft Supplies** (stamps, paper crafts, plastic canvas, etc.)

Jan **Miscellaneous** (working sewing machines, sergers)

Feb **Storage** (bins, baskets, organizers)

We will not accept non-working sewing machines, large items such as looms, magazines, or dolls. If you, or someone you know, has a large donation, please text Elaine Brouillard at 509-551-2355 or Linda Glaman at 509-539-2771 to make arrangements.

We meet at 1 pm at the White Bluffs Quilt Museum, 294 Torbett Street, Richland, on the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Thursday of the month. We will be expanding the meeting times of the TCQG small group *Quilters of the Round TUIT* to include the first Monday of the month starting in January. Donations are also accepted at all guild meetings. All guild members are welcome to help sort. All scraps are free to the workers and you may pay for those items you want to buy the day you sort. We have over 70 boxes to sort before the show. See you there!

Please fold fabric from selvage to selvage and then again from selvage to the fold. Measure the fabric and safety pin the information on the fabric. Wrap the fabric around a 6½-inch ruler. Thank you again for your donation. It is one of many income streams needed to pay for the March Quilt Show.


Featuring our Guest Artist **Robin Long** of Robin Ruth Design

This year's theme is "Every Quilt Tells A Story." From the quilts that went together perfectly (exceedingly rare) to the quilt we have (I've) been fighting with deserve to have their stories told. The quilt that was meant for one person, but was given to someone else... why? The quilt that had a typo in the instructions (quite common); tell the story of how you resolved that. Did you inherit a quilt that you finished? You can look at any quilt and ask who, what, where, when and how; our quilts need us to put that into words.

I love seeing a collection of quilts from a class or workshop. They might be the same pattern but completely different because of the fabrics chosen. Was it chosen to match a decor? Did they request something in blue, or to commemorate an event? I once chose a fabric because it fell off the shelf in front of me (self-imposed challenge not recommended). And a friend gave me three yards of "ugly fabric"...still working on that one. Regardless of where the inspiration came from, there is a story behind it.

For whatever reason we quilt, we chose to do it with friends. That's why our quilt shows have been so successful. Volunteer sign-ups will be available soon. Check out the job descriptions and join the fun!

Urgent Help Wanted— need to fill Communications position

Dianne Cramer is stepping down from her publicity positions, social media and quilt show communications/publicity. **Please consider taking on one of these important positions.**

In Dianne's words:

"My position is social media for guild and for the show.

I send out flyers, posters, and bookmarks to the shops both locally and there is a list about 50 shops that I mail out as well. I also place the ad for the Country Register, and any radio or news ads. And I coordinate both with the Show chair and co-chair. Printing and sending out all the information by the end of each year, for the next year prior to the show. Other than that, any activities that go on in the guild gets posted to social media to keep our guild up to date, and of relevance. The biggest thing I do is the mailing at the end of the year, other than that, its pretty quiet.

Make sure the ad is placed by Dec 1st and flyers/postcards/postcards/bookmarks etc are printed and distributed out by November and mailed out to shops by Jan 5th or so..."

Dianne also photographs Guild events and posts regularly to our Facebook and Instagram accounts.

If you will have items for sale in the Boutique (formerly Member Market), please fill out a registration form with either Judy Urrutia (morning meetings) or Jean Kimerling (evening meetings). Each person can have up to 5 items for sale — quilts, table runners, table toppers, vests or jackets, home-made dolls or teddy bears, etc. We are registering ahead of time so that we have an idea of what we need to do to show the items in the best way possible. Please give us sizes of your quilts, etc., and remember when pricing your items that the Guild takes 25% of the sale price.

Bring your items to the booth on Thursday before the Quilt Show between 9:00am and 1:00pm, and pick up any unsold items at the end of the show.


Potholders and Placemats!







Remembering Sandy Moroney

Sandy Moroney was our free-spirited sunshine coordinator, making and usually hand-delivering sympathy cards for our members. She has lost her fight with cancer, but her spirit lives on in the pieces she has made during her time in our Guild, in the Bee at White Bluffs, and in her Boardman Quilt Group.

This dimensional piece uses clumps of organza to add depth and color to the Volkswagens at the nearby Riverside VW dealership.




This is Sandy's display when she was the featured artist at the Boardman Quilt Show in October 2019.


