## New guidelines for Member Featured Artist process

The board recently made several important changes to the process of nominating candidates and voting for Member Featured Artist (MFA). Changes appear in **bold** below:

- Members at the **May** meetings may nominate **up to three** candidates for MFA.
- Nominees for MFA must have been members for at least **three** years prior to the meeting when nominations are made.
- Presentations and balloting will take place at the **July** meeting. Members must be present to vote.

After nominations, the top three candidates will each prepare a short bio (150-200 words) and provide a "head shot" and photos of two representative quilts, all by June 20 for publication in the July/Aug newsletter. The candidates will also prepare a 10 to 15-minute presentation to be given at the July meetings. Voting takes place after the presentations.

The successful candidate is the new Member Featured Artist for the following year's Quilt Show. The MFA will prepare a display of up to 12 8-ft frames. The MFA is encouraged, but not required, to create at least one item especially for the show in which they will be featured. He/she is also encouraged, but not required, to create an entry for the Guild Challenge.

Updated guidelines for MFA will be posted on the Guild's website (tcquilters.org) prior to the May meetings.

# Quilt Show News

## Quilt Show: How Did We Do?

The annual quilt show takes a year of planning, starting as soon as the previous show finishes. The show chair picks the show theme and featured guest artist. A show challenge and member featured artist are picked with the help of guild members. Our wonderful graphic artist designs logos for the show publicity. A multitude of volunteers work behind the scenes to get the show ready. From May to March, members donate 'used' items for sale in the Round Tuit Room. In the fall, vendors are solicited for our merchant mall. Quilt registration begins January 1<sup>st</sup> and then it's "Show Time" in March. An army of volunteers makes it happen.

The quilt show is the guild's primary source of income from admissions, vendor fees, raffle ticket sales, Unique Boutique sales & commissions, and Round Tuit Room sales. When all the income and expenses are tallied up, the guild hopes to reap a profit that will allow us to do the whole process again. Income and expenses are incurred in 2025 and 2026. Here is how we did:

### Community Service

We are doing a really awesome job with community service quilts: **the total quilts delivered through April is 156**. Fifty-nine quilts were delivered January and February. For March, thirty-six quilts were delivered. For April, we did excellent: sixty-one quilts were delivered. Two other quilts were held back for now, one for Habitat for Humanity and the other for the Hospice veterans. The reason we had so many quilts turned in in April is that some were held back for the quilt show and some we tried to sell in the Unique Boutique.

If you are turning in a top or finished quilt that you have made with your stash (not a kit), please make sure you have a community service tag attached to the item. You can print one from the [guild website](#).

### Community Service Anticipates UGM's Need for Twin-Size Quilts

Union Gospel Mission (UGM), a long-time recipient of comfort quilts from the Guild, is giving us another opportunity to be of service: they plan to build a new facility for women and children.

Land has already been purchased in a safe neighborhood in Kennewick. Construction costs are estimated at \$9.5 million; less than \$2 million remains to be raised. When the building is complete, it will contain indoor and outdoor play spaces, classroom space, private offices (for counseling, medical services, and employment assistance) and apartments.

The apartments will be furnished with between 64 and 75 twin-size beds which will need twin-size quilts. The goal is to accumulate more than that in order to give moms and kids choices as they personalize their space.

The community service committee will add these larger quilts – 70”x90” is the ideal size (15” drop on two sides and bottom) – to our wish list. We will be on the lookout for patterns to kit as well; if you have suggestions, please contact Laurel Sutton, [coversincolors@yahoo.com](mailto:coversincolors@yahoo.com).

## Raffle quilt is inspiration for inmates

I had a nice chat with Kathy Rither at the quilt show. She won the raffle quilt in 1998. She spoke of how she was just going to donate the money but was talked into filling out the ticket stubs. The raffle quilt that year was called "Jewel in a Box." She mentioned that she was working in jail with female inmates as part of her work with The Tri-Cities Women's Jail Outreach program when her husband received the call that she had won the raffle quilt. She explained that the name of the quilt was perfect as she sees the female inmates as "jewels in a box". She states that, "like the quilt, their lives have been torn apart by various experiences, then sewn back together with love, insight, and new self-control".\* She said that wherever she goes to do her outreach the quilt goes with her. For me it was really interesting to find out that the raffle quilt is serving others. I really enjoyed talking with her.

## Color, Contrast, and Cohesion

**Taught by: Diane Harris (aka - the Stash Bandit)**

**Cost:** \$60 plus tax (8.8% = \$5.28); total - \$65.28

**Date/Time/Location:** Tuesday August 18, 2026, 10-3, White Bluffs Quilt Museum

**Max Class size:** 12 (15 if sufficient students have portable tables).

**Enrollment Deadline:** August 1, 2026

The three C's—Color, Contrast and Cohesion—can make or break your quilt! Learn to control them as you start a simply pieced scrap quilt.



Students can pick one of several designs. See the back of the flyer for pictures.

### Supplies:

**Fabric:** A nice variety of quilt-weight cotton fabrics in lights, mediums and darks. Solids or prints. Small pieces are okay but pieces from 10" to 12" square are more useful and efficient. Don't stress over fabric - whatever you have can be put to good use! You can go totally scrappy or choose a color scheme, If you choose a specific color recipe, have lights, mediums and darks available within each color.

**Patterns:** Patterns will be available before class and at the class. You need not make a huge quilt. It's fine to make a few blocks before deciding where your project will go and how large it will be. This is about learning the concepts and having fun in the process. Please do not start sewing before class, as that defeats the purpose. You will have plenty of time.

### Tools:

- Sewing machine with the manual, presser feet, cord, and foot pedal
- rotary cutter and mat
- Neutral colored thread, 50 or 60 weight.

If you have a portable design wall of some kind, please bring it to class.

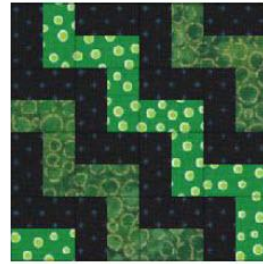
